



MAIN HOUSE



- The main house is two stories with a full unfinished basement.
- The first floor of the main house includes two bedrooms, two offices, a living room, a dining room, a commercial kitchen, and three and a half baths.
- The second floor of the main house has five bedrooms and five baths.
- The rear of the house is currently used as the main entrance.
- There is an upper porch on the rear of the house that, a wrap-around porch on the front, and an open deck on the side.
- The house was renovated between 1991 and 1993, during which many of the original materials were either retained or repurposed.
- Wide entry foyers and hallways
- French doors, arch doorway, transoms over doors
- Heart pine flooring
- Fire suppression system in kitchen
- Commercial exhaust fan in kitchen.
- Plate warmer in kitchen
- Ice machine and freezer
- 3 traditional hot water heaters
- 5 tankless hot water heaters (4 in rooms, 1 supplement in kitchen)
- Laundry in basement

LANDSCAPING

The trees on the property were likely planted in the 1890s, possibly during the same period when the Biltmore House was being landscaped. Some of the same tree species found at the Biltmore House may be present on the property. The Pacolet Area Conservancy has recognized nine trees at Ivy Terrace as part of their Treasured Tree List. Ivy is a notable feature of the property's landscape, suggesting that it continues to grow and be present on the premises.

COTTAGES

In addition to the main house, there are two cottages situated on the property.

RED COTTAGE

The "Red Cottage" serves as a versatile space that can be utilized as a guest cottage, a vacation rental, or a studio for creative endeavors. It provides a cozy and private accommodation option for visitors or can be used as a space for personal artistic pursuits.

The "Brown Cottage" is designed to facilitate professional meetings and corporate retreats. It offers a flexible layout that can be easily converted into living quarters if desired. This cottage provides a dedicated space for conducting business gatherings, allowing for a productive yet serene environment.

OWNERSHIP TIMELINE OF IVY TERRACE

- William G Hinson was the original owner of the property, likely purchasing it around 1887 or 1888. Hinson, who also owned Stiles Point plantation on James Island, South Carolina, was an active figure in Saluda and was involved in developing Colombia Heights. His earliest recorded sale of lots in Columbia Heights was in 1891. He held onto Ivy Terrace until his death in 1919.
- After Hinson's passing, his heirs sold Ivy
 Terrace (referred to as Ivy Lodge in the deed)
 to P.A. Wilcox in 1920. Wilcox held the property
 until his own death. In 1925, the administrator
 of Wilcox's estate sold Ivy Terrace at auction to
 L.L. Clippard.
- The Clippard family operated Ivy Terrace as a boarding house from the mid-1930s onward.
 During their tenure, a second story was added to the property.
- In 1966, John and Betty Thompson purchased lvy Terrace from the Clippards. They moved a cottage to the southeast corner of the lot from where the carport is now located and sold that cottage, along with the green house behind the main house. The lot was subdivided, and anything south of the driveway is no longer part of the remaining 1.15 acres. The driveway itself is part of the 1.15 acres and is subject to a perpetual easement granted to the owners of the two subdivided lots.
- In September 1991, the Thompsons sold Ivy
 Terrace to the McGuires. The property is now
 titled in the name of Ivy Terrace of Saluda, LLC,
 which is solely owned by the McGuires. The
 back cottage construction was completed in
 1994, and main house renovations were
 finished in 1993. From 1993-1997, Ivy Terrace
 was used as a Bed & Breakfast Inn, and the
 McGuires have since used it as their summer
 residence.

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
